

Scheduled Open Training online



An adaptation of our Sex Offender Awareness training for small organisations

Aim of the course:

- To increase participants' awareness of sexual offending.
- To provide an overview of how offenders operate, including an exploration of the grooming process.
- To consider the impact of sex offending on victims and the wider community.
- To examine issues of offender denial, minimisation and victim-blaming
- To discuss responses to sexual offending: what is most likely to be effective?
- To introduce the principles and practice of risk assessment and the management of offenders in the community, with an overview of multi-agency support available.
- To answer some tricky questions including: how can smaller organisations access specialist support and advice: what roles and responsibilities apply to our own organisations? How can we share sensitive information safely and legally: How can we keep ourselves, our service users and colleagues safe?

Who is this course for?

This course is ideal for all those with a duty of care who know that they do or might come into contact with sexual offenders as part of their work with non-offending populations.

It is designed for organisations with small numbers of staff who may come into contact with offenders.

(We recommend organisations with larger teams to our bespoke 1 or 2-day Awareness & Working with Sex Offender courses

Who will deliver the training?

The training will be delivered via Zoom/Teams by TDI's specialist training consultants who are expert in engaging with participants and helping them learn in a relaxed environment, whilst addressing sensitive and complex subjects.

The course runs over one day (2 x 2 hour sessions) using interactive techniques and media, including group work, videos, case studies and discussion.
